- NOTICE 1: TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR ANY AWARD, A 4-H MEMBER MUST COMPLETE A 4-H RECORD BOOK AND SUBMIT IT TO THE NUECES COUNTY 4-H (NC4H) OFFICE BY 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023. NC4H Record Book judging is set for **JUNE 1, 2023.**
- NOTICE 2: ALL COMPLETED AWARD APPLICATIONS ARE DUE IN THE NC4H OFFICE BY 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
- NOTICE 3: NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

#### MEMBER CATEGORIES.

- JUNIOR Grades 3, 4, and 5
- INTERMEDIATE Grades 6, 7, and 8
- SENIOR Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

**4-H AGE REQUIREMENTS.** Youth may participate in 4-H year from September 1 of grade three through August 31. following completion of grade twelve, with these age restrictions:

- Minimum age 8 (in addition to being in the third grade).
- Maximum age 18 (as of September 1, 2022).
- Special education youth who are older than nineteen and have not graduated from high school may
  participate in 4-H Youth Development programs as members, with approval by the county Extension agent.
  Participation is limited to the club or county level. County Extension staff have the option, on a case-by-case
  basis, to allow Special Education youth older than nineteen to participate in competitive events at the club
  or county level.

**YEAR PIN.** The purpose of awarding Year Pins is to recognize the number of years a 4-H member has participated in the 4-H program. The year pin presented will coincide with the number of years a child has been in the 4-H program rather than the number of years a record book has been completed. Qualifications:

- (1) Completion of at least one 4-H project.
- (2) Complete and turn into the 4-H Office by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023, a completed 4-H record book.
- (3) Award is for Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors.
- (4) The Year Pin is to be purchased by NC4H Council and presented at the annual Awards program.

**RECORD BOOK AWARD.** This award's purpose is to recognize 4-H members for outstanding project work. Qualifications:

- (1) Follow guidelines as outlined in the Texas 4-H Clover.
- (2) Only one record book is submitted per member per year.
- (3) Record books are due by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023, in the NC4H Office.
- (4) The County medal will be awarded in the entered record book project area.
- (5) Medals will go to Juniors, Intermediates, and Seniors.
- (6) This award will be given at the annual Awards program.
- (7) Award. One County medal as outlined in the Texas 4-H Clover.

**OUTSTANDING SENIOR 4-H'ERS.** The purpose is to recognize a **SENIOR 4-H** member for outstanding achievement. Qualifications:

- (1) Classified as a Senior 4-H member as of September 1, 2022.
- (2) Other award requirements are the same as those for Gold Star Award, except for age.
- (3) Awards will be awarded based on the interview judges' decisions.
- (4) Take part in an interview (see Gold Star, #9 for interview information).
- (5) This is presented and awarded only once to recipients.
- (6) The awards plaque will be presented at the annual Awards program.

**GOLD STAR AWARD.** The Gold Star's purpose is to recognize **SENIOR** 4-H'ers for outstanding achievement. Criteria for selection:

- (1) The 4-H member must have at least completed or be completing their ninth-grade school year at the time of the application.
- (2) The 4-H member must have completed at least three years in 4-H including the current year.
- (3) The Gold Star Award will be presented to the most deserving young people without regard to sex.
- (4) The 4-H member must submit an awards program record book in the year the member is to be considered for the Gold Star Award.
- (5) Projects and Activities. During his or her years in 4-H, the 4-H member must have:
  - A. Completed projects in three different project areas.
  - B. Participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas:
    - (1) Educational Presentations/Speeches
    - (2) Contests
    - (3) Project Exhibit/Livestock Shows
    - (4) Camps
    - (5) Leadership Lab
    - (6) Citizenship Activities
    - (7) Public Relations, for example, demonstrations, speeches, poster displays, club exhibits, project shows, radio, TV, newspapers, special projects.
- (8) Other, which may include Exchange Program, fund raising, Texas State, and National Congress. NOTE: It is not expected that all the above requirements for projects and activities are to be completed in the current year. They may have been accomplished over the entire period the 4-H'er has been in the program.
  - (6) During the member's years in 4-H, the 4-H member must have exhibited leadership skills in one or more of the following areas.
    - Must have served as an officer or committee chairperson at a level of 4-H organization (club, county, district, and state).
    - B. Must have served as a junior or teen leader in an activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult leader.
  - (7) Community Service. The 4-H member must have participated in one or more community service activities, for example:
    - A. Working or counseling with junior 4-H members.
    - B. Community service projects, either individual, group, or club projects.
    - C. Must have motivated other 4-H members through participation in demonstrations and/or exhibits.
  - (8) Other qualifications:
    - A. The recipients may receive this award only once.
    - B. To be considered as a candidate, the qualifying 4-H'er must submit a completed application by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
  - (9) Interviews will be given by a set of judges. Topics will include project experiences, community service, leadership, and outside activities.
    - Interviews will take place on JUNE 13, 2023.
    - B. Interviews will be scheduled for 10-minute increments.
    - C. Video interviews are allowed on a special circumstance basis only. Please contact the 4-H agent to schedule a time.
    - Sample interview questions will be available upon request.

- E. Judges will have access to the award applications.
- (10) Award. A Gold Star pin, a framed certificate, and a plaque sponsored by the 4-H Council.

GOLDEN CLOVER AWARD. The Golden Clover Award's purpose is to recognize outstanding achievements by a 4-H SENIOR member who has been a Gold Star recipient. This award is given to encourage Gold Star recipients to remain active in 4-H. Criteria:

- Is the same as those for Gold Star Award.
- (2) To be considered a candidate for this award, the qualifying individual must submit a completed application by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
- (3) Awards will be awarded based on the interview judges' decisions.
- (4) The recipient may receive this award only once.
- (5) Award. Plaques for a maximum of two recipients will be presented at the Awards Program.

**OUTSTANDING INTERMEDIATE 4-H'ERS.** This award's purpose is to recognize outstanding achievements by **INTERMEDIATE** members. Up to four awards may be awarded based on the interview judges' decision. Qualifications:

- (1) Must be classified as an Intermediate 4-H member as of September 1, 2022.
- (2) Have completed at least one year in 4-H.
- (3) Take part in an interview (see Gold Star, #9 for interview information).
- (4) The application will be presented to the interview judges.
- (5) Criteria for selection are the same as for Gold Star, but with the following changes:
  - A. #5A Completed projects in two different project areas.
  - B. #5B Participated in one or more activities in at least two of the following areas.
  - C. #6 During the members' years in 4-H, the 4-H member must have exhibited leadership skills.

- **4-H ROOKIE AWARD.** To recognize outstanding achievements by a **FIRST-YEAR 4-H MEMBER** is the purpose of this award. Clover Kids years are excluded. One male and one female selected. Qualifications:
  - (1) Eight years old and be in the third grade or 9 years old, but not over nineteen, by September 1, 2022.
  - (2) Must be completing the first year in the 4-H program.
  - (3) Turn in a completed application by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
  - (4) The county winner will be selected by interview.
  - (5) The recipient may receive this award only once.
  - (6) The award plaque will be presented at the Awards program.
- **4-H JACKET AWARD.** Does not require an interview. 4-H members in the NC4H Program will be recognized for their outstanding participation in all 4-H club events and activities during the current year. To be eligible for this award:
  - (1) Each 4-H member must submit a completed application for this award.
  - (2) Applications are available from the NC4H Office and are due by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
  - (3) The point system used for this award is outlined below.
    - A. Attendance at Regular 4-H Club Meetings three points for each meeting attended.
    - B. Project Work five points for each project completed as demonstrated in the Record Book.
    - C. Participation Record Books, Roundup, District 11 4-H Judging Contests (soils, livestock, horse, range, entomology, wool, mohair, meats), Food Show/Food Challenge, Canning & Yeast Bread Show, Fashion Show/Storyboard/Duds to Dazzle, Photography Contest, County-wide Club Officer Training, District 11 Leadership Lab and Junior Leader Lab training, Texas 4-H Congress, Texas 4-H Conference Center Brownwood camps (Horizons, County Camp, Mission Possible, Prime Time), 4-H Horse Shows, Cotton Country Classic, Coastal Bend Classic County (five points), District (three points), and State (two points).
    - D. Major Livestock Shows (2 points per show, maximum twelve points).
    - E. Nueces County Junior Livestock Show Livestock, Homemaking, and Ag Mechanics & Handcraft Divisions - (maximum one point per entry, one point per category, maximum three points per category per division).
    - F. Leadership 4-H Club Officer (list office held), 4-H Ambassador (county/state), 4-H Council (list office held), County (five points), District (five points). and State (five points).
  - (4) Recipients may receive this award only once.
  - (5) Jacket awards will be presented at the annual Awards Program.
  - (6) No record book required.

**CHARLES E. TERRY AWARD.** The purpose of this award is to recognize a JUNIOR/INTERMEDIATE and a SENIOR 4-H club member, who exemplifies the spirit of 4-H, the member who continually tries to make the best better and improve themselves through involvement in 4-H activities, the member who never gives up, despite not having been a big winner, the member who keeps on trying, and shows improvement with each attempt being made.

(1) Nominees are not to be former recipients of Gold Star or Golden Clover.

- (2) Nominations can be made by club managers and project leaders, or County Extension Agent.
- (3) Candidates must have turned in a completed application by 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023.
- (4) Recipients will be selected by agents outside Nueces County on awards criteria as outlined by the nomination form.
- (5) May receive this award only once.
- (6) The award plaque will be presented at the Awards Program.

**DANFORTH "I DARE YOU" AWARD.** The purpose is to help youth measure up to their own best qualities and aspire to attain constructive lives of service and good citizenship. Qualifications:

- (1) Must be classified as a Senior 4-H member as of September 1, 2022.
- (2) Interview judges will select county winners.
- (3) Award. "I Dare You" Book and a picture-framed certificate to be presented at the annual Awards program.

**EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION AWARD.** Its purpose is to recognize 4-H'ers who present their educational presentation at various times and increase their proficiency in making a public presentation; to share things learned in the 4-H program, thereby promoting 4-H educational presentations and the 4-H program. Requirements:

- (1) Give a demonstration initially at county Roundup.
- (2) Present to non-4-H groups, such as service clubs, classrooms, 4-H groups, 4-H projects group of five or more people, and community 4-H club meetings, or present at District 11 4-H contest.

#### Application:

- (1) Must be returned no later than 5:00 P.M., MAY 30, 2023, to NC4H Office.
- (2) Award. A plaque will be presented at the annual Awards program.

MISTY WIMBERLY 4-H AMBASSADOR AWARD. It is given to a graduating high school senior. The awards decision is made by NC4H Ambassador Advisors.


